

Chief's message

The information and photos in this issue of *The Defender* show so much of what is wonderful about the people here at LOPD. But I know that there are always issues that we must face, and ways that we can improve. That is why in this issue we are sharing information on the department's vacancy rate. As if the COVID pandemic didn't create enough challenges, we are now facing a new twist on one of our greatest challenges: recruiting and keeping outstanding people.

Early in the pandemic LOPD achieved the lowest vacancy rate in the known history of the department – close to 6%. Over the last year, as is happening More




There's more job openings than there are applicants. So, recruitment is first and foremost of what we do right now. Everything else can wait so we can hire.

Every Monday first thing, Human Resources Director Ronald Herrera and the HR team check the week's application submissions. Herrera says that in his 7 years with LOPD, he can't recall a Monday without a single qualified applicant – until last month.

"I thought maybe we were missing something or the system was malfunctioning," he said. "It's shocking."

Herrera says the HR team hits all the recommended avenues for posting and advertising jobs, including the Bar Bulletin, numerous professional and college job boards, and internal and listsery emails.


In addition, the team supports Training & Recruitment Director Liz Holmes and others who go to hiring fairs and networking events.

"Short of advertising on a billboard, which state agencies don't normally do, what else can we do?"

HR departments across the nation are scrambling to answer this. LOPD's HR team will be attending a conference on recruiting during a turbulent economy and post-COVID.

In the meantime, Herrera and the HR team continue to look for recruits everywhere they can, including top-notch restaurant servers and customer service workers. Herrera asks for help in doing the same.

"Please talk to friends, family, people you run into and encourage people to go to law school and pursue public defense," he said.

across the country, more people have left than have come in, and that vacancy rate has increased. The good news is we are still well below the average vacancy rate for state agencies around the New Mexico. We have been able to fill many positions over the last several months, and new hires are joining the team, including 21 LPs starting next week. But there is no easy or quick fix. We may cycle in and out of this hiring struggle as the national economy figures itself out and people adjust their lives in response to the pandemic.

On a happy note, we are thrilled to have been allocated an additional 26 FTE this fiscal year! Eighteen have been designated as core staff positions and 8 as attorney positions. With new positions added in many our offices around the state this fiscal year, we will eventually see even more coworkers to carry out our mission.

So, thanks to all of you for hanging in there and, as always, for your dedication to our clients and to each other.


Team Hobbs talking Restorative Justice
